Nursery and Early Toddlers:

The Nursery and Early Toddlers class is designed for younger siblings at The Learning Village and offers a fun and nurturing environment where children can play, learn, and develop social skills in a group of their peers.

Preschool:

For this age group, we focus on cultivating a loving and safe environment where children can learn about God and enjoy fellowship with other children while also guiding their development through play based activities and actively engaging with each child to ensure every need. Through guided activities, interactive games, and age-appropriate lessons, our preschoolers will explore foundational concepts such as colors, shapes, numbers, and social cues. The class encourages creativity, motor skill development, and peer interaction, fostering a love of learning and helping children build confidence in a group setting.

Physical Education: All ages

The Physical Education (PE) program for grades K-12 is designed to promote physical fitness, skill development, teamwork, and a lifelong appreciation for active, healthy living. Through a variety of age-appropriate activities, students will engage in exercises that build cardiovascular endurance, strength, flexibility, coordination, and agility.

Adventures in Creation: K-2nd grade

In this engaging and hands-on homeschool class for kindergarten through second grade, young learners will explore the wonders of God's creation. Each class will focus on a different aspect of

creation, such as animals, plants, weather, seasons, and the human body, while incorporating simple Bible verses that highlight God's power and love. Activities will include science experiments and songs that reinforce learning in a fun and meaningful way.

Motions and Simple Machines: 3rd-5th grade

Get ready to move! The brand-new Motion and Simple Machines course is lled with hands-on activities! Students will learn about motion and force, gravity, pulleys, levers, and so much more in this one-of-a-kind unit study. Creation vs Evolution and Comic Book Design: 3rd- 5th grade

Adam and Eve are discovering all that God has created. Our students will use their imaginations to tell the stories of these discoveries in comic book form, all while making the case that God created everything.

Choir: 3rd-12th grade

This choir class is designed to provide students from 3rd through 12th grade with a comprehensive and enjoyable experience in choral singing. The course will cover essential vocal techniques, including breath control, pitch accuracy, diction, and tone production. Students will learn to sing in unison and harmony, exploring a 2 diverse repertoire of music that spans various genres, cultures, and historical periods. Throughout the course, students will develop their musical literacy and gain an understanding of the basics of music theory, such as rhythm, melody, and harmony, which will enhance their overall musicianship.

Applied Engineering: 6th-12th grade

Study of God's Design in Nature is a fascinating homeschool science curriculum. Students will study biomimicry which reveals how man-made designs are inspired by God's design in nature. This study uses captivating books, engaging worksheets, and hands-on activities to demonstrate the world's need for God's creative genius.

Apologetics: 6th- 12th grade

Apologetics is the practice of defending Christianity and Christian beliefs through argumentation and discourse. The word "apologetics" comes from the Greek word apologia, which means "defense". Our goal for this course is to help students to: Clarify the gospel message, strengthen their faith and ability to defend it, help them learn and gain confidence in witnessing to others and attract others to the gospel, while helping people come to faith in Christ.

Debating Apologetics: Defending Your Beliefs with Logic and Grace

This is a companion course to Apologetics and will alternate weekly. This course introduces students to the art of apologetics—the reasoned defense of faith and beliefs—through structured debate and critical thinking. Students will explore foundational apologetic arguments, logical reasoning, and effective communication strategies. Engaging in respectful discourse, they will learn to analyze worldviews, respond to tough questions, and articulate their beliefs with clarity, confidence, and grace.

Studying Great Speeches: 6th- 12th grade

This course explores some of history's most powerful and influential speeches, examining their rhetorical strategies, historical contexts, and lasting impact. Students will analyze speeches from political leaders, activists, and other influential figures to understand how language can inspire, persuade, and drive social change.
